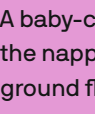


Get online quickly with the "Futurium Hotspot" (Wi-Fi). Free of charge, of course.

Make your way baggage-free through possible futures. Please store your jackets and bags in the green lockers. Deposit coins required: € 1 or 50 cent.



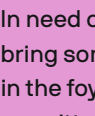
The toilets are located on the ground floor directly behind the information desk and next to the entrances to the Forum.
