

Quiet Hour on 13 March 2026 from 4 - 6 p.m.

Information to help you prepare for your quiet visit.

We look forward to seeing you! We will do our best to make your visit as pleasant as possible.

Welcome to the Quiet Hour at Futurium.

Important points first

- Our studios are available as quiet rooms:
on the ground floor, opposite the entrance.
- Information on quieter areas can be found in the entrance area:
a sensory map is available at our reception desk.
- The stations in the exhibition are quieter than usual. Some are
switched off. A separate overview provides information about all
exhibits that are restricted during the quiet hour.
- The lighting in the exhibition is dimmed. We provide sunglasses.
- We also provide earplugs, noise-cancelling headphones and fidget
toys.
- You are permitted to bring your own noise-cancelling headphones
and other aids that you rely on to the exhibition.
- There are no guided tours or announcements during the Quiet Hour.
Announcements are only made in emergencies, e.g. in the event of
an evacuation.

Who else will be in the building?

- There are far fewer visitors in the building than usual.
The number is limited to 300.
- You can recognise the attendants by their dark clothing and orange name badges.
- If the distance to certain exhibits is not maintained, it is the attendants' job to point this out. Apart from that, you will not be touched or spoken to in the exhibition.
- If you would like to speak to Futurium staff, you are welcome to do so.
- Other Futurium staff members can also be recognised by their orange name tags.

Entrance area

- Our reception staff will be happy to help you with any questions you may have.
- There are lockers available for storing jackets and bags. Bags larger than A4 size must be locked away. A cloakroom is also available.

Communication

- In the exhibition (upper floor) and in the lab (lower floor), you will find visitor assistants wearing dark clothing with orange name tags. You can approach them at any time and they will be happy to help you with any questions or concerns you may have.

Food and drink

Please do not eat or drink in the exhibition rooms. You are welcome to visit the restaurant or take a break in the foyer on the ground floor.

Toilets

- Located on the ground floor to the right of the entrance and accessible via stairs, near the lockers.
- An accessible toilet is also located on the ground floor, to the right of the entrance. Please feel free to ask our visitor services staff for assistance.

What can I do if it gets too much?

- There is a quiet room on the ground floor. It is signposted. You can retreat there.
- There is also a quieter area in our lab in the basement. However, this is not completely enclosed.
- You can leave the building at any time between 4 and 6 p.m. and return later.
- Fidget toys, earplugs and sunglasses are available at several pick-up stations throughout the building. You are welcome to use these, but we ask that you return the items afterwards.
- Ear-protecting headphones can also be borrowed from reception on the ground floor.
