From 30 May to 9 June 2018, the Futurium will host its first Workshop Weeks. Under the heading “Areas of Tension. Approaching Possible Futures”, the Futurium will give an insight into its work on the path to its final launch in 2019. Visitors are invited to participate in developing content and creating objects for future exhibitions.

“Working together with the public, we want to try out new formats and develop new content. The Workshop Weeks are all about the major issues of the future, such as digitisation, civic involvement, climate protection and sustainability – always keeping in mind the guiding question ‘How do we want to live?’,” says Dr Stefan Brandt, the Director of the Futurium.

The programme for the Workshop Weeks includes, among other things, new participatory formats, evening debates, artistic projects and interactive offerings for children and young people. The Futurium will round off the event by opening its doors to the public as one of the participants in the Long Night of the Sciences on 9 June. Entry to the Workshop Weeks is free of charge; on the Long Night of the Sciences, regular ticket fees apply. A detailed programme will be announced in mid-April.

The opening of the Futurium in its entirety is scheduled for spring 2019.

The Futurium is simultaneously stage, museum, laboratory and forum of the future. Situated in the heart of Berlin, this arena for interdisciplinary dialogue unites under the same roof an exhibition with vivid scenarios, an interactive laboratory in which visitors can make their own explorations, and an events venue. The Futurium is open to all those with an interest in the future and a passion for shaping it. Explore, discuss, test – the Futurium allows its visitors a glimpse into the world of tomorrow. It shows the challenges, opportunities and risks of the future, but also the building blocks with which it can be shaped. In doing so, the Futurium is at the same time a location of encounters: players from the spheres of politics, science and business, the arts and society come together to exchange their concepts of the future. More than 5,000 square metres on three floors are available for this purpose.
